Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2018-06-13 (STYR 2018/1341). The syllabus comes into effect 2019-01-01 and is valid from the spring semester 2019.

General information

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Music: Vocal Studies, Piano, Guitar, Recorder, Harpsichord, Symphony Orchestra Instruments, first cycle 180 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of study Specialisation

Music GXX, First cycle, in-depth level of the course cannot be classified

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- have orientational knowledge of musical form and structure and also
- have orientational knowledge of harmonic and four part writing principles in music from different epochs.

Course content

The course consist mainly of lectures and individual work with a focus on basic four part writing. Other writing exercises are carried out in parallel (arrangements and compositions).

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons and group lessons, seminars and individual work (practicing, preparation).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and final tests. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.
