Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have a developed knowledge and control of the most common studio equipment and the most common computer programs within electroacoustic music, composition of instrumental music as well as sound technique,
- have a broadened knowledge of current development in music technique,

- have a broadened knowledge of the history, development and different aesthetic directions of electroacoustic music and also
- have an elementary knowledge of diffusion of electronic music.

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have a developed ability to analyse and reflect on electroacoustic music and
- have the ability to, at a developed level, create and realize own artistic thoughts and ideas within the field of electroacoustic music.

Course content

The course can include studio lessons in technique and composition, individual composition work, subject related seminars, music listening within the field of electroacoustic music and the reading of different texts on the subject. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUSI78.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons and group lessons in studio as well as seminars. A large part of the work consists of individual work in studio. The students' work are presented at concerts during the course.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.
