Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2017-11-29 to be valid from 2017-11-29, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

Compulsory course in Master's Programme in Church Music: second cycle 120 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish and English

Main field of studies

Music

Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- have good direction towards excellent knowledge of different musical styles and their performance practices and concert traditions,
- have good direction towards an excellent ability to co-operate with others in joint projects and ensembles,

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- have good direction towards an excellent ability to develop and critically assess own ideas and critically review own and others' viewpoints,
- have good direction towards an excellent ability to create and realize own as well as shared artistic ideas and visions,
- have good direction towards an excellent ability to meet the requirements set on personal image and musical performance in concert activities in different contexts.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

- show the ability to identify the personal need for further knowledge and skill development,
- show an understanding of the role of art in society and
- show good direction towards the ability to make qualified assessments considering relevant artistic, ethical and social aspects.

Course content

The course can contain projects, study visits and more within the field of church music.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of group lessons, seminars, guest lectures, workshops/master classes, rehearsals, presentations and individual work. Attendance is compulsory for projects within the education.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and, in applicable cases, project presentations. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

In addition to general entry requirements for higher education at second cycle level the following specific entry requirements are applied:

Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Master's Programme in Music.
