General Information

Compulsory course in Master's Programme in Music: Vocal Studies, Recorder, Symphony Orchestra Instruments, second cycle 120 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish and English

Main field of studies

Music

Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards very good musical craftsmanship,
- show good direction towards broadened knowledge within the main field of study,

- show good direction towards deepened knowledge and understanding of part or parts of the main field of study, including orientation in current research and development work, and
- show good direction towards knowledge of artistic processes in general and own working methods in particular.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach, and that of others, in a wider artistic context,
- show good direction towards the ability to independently solve artistic problems and problems regarding interpretation,
- show good direction towards creating and realizing own artistic ideas with a personal expression and also
- show good direction towards a very good ability for musical interplay in different constellations and ensembles.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to make assessments considering relevant artistic aspects.

Course content

The course mainly consists of relevant literature for the specific instrument. In the courses Study and Interpretation 1- 4 the repertoire should comprehensively highlight the different epochs of music history including contemporary music.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons, group lessons, seminars, guest lectures, workshops/master classes and individual work (practicing, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment, concerts or tests. Examination rules, such as e.g. examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.

Entry requirements

Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Bachelor's Programme in Music.
