Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show a developed technical skill on the instrument and
- when playing, show a developed understanding of the style and expression of the current repertoire.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show the ability to independently study and carry out artistic assignments and also
- show the ability to critically reflect on the personal artistic approach.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show the ability to have a constructive dialogue with other artists.

Course content

The course content is decided by the individual student and the course coordinator in consultation with the faculty management. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUF12.

Course design

The course consists of individual lessons and individual work (practicing, preparations, projects), and can also be carried out as group studies.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and concerts or tests. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with

a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
