Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards a basic technical ability on the instrument and
- when playing/singing, show good direction towards a basic understanding of the style, expressions and improvisation formulas of the current repertoire.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to study and carry out artistic assignments together with others,
- show good direction towards the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach and that of fellow musicians,
- show good direction towards a basic ability for musical interplay in different constellations and ensembles and also
- show good direction towards the ability to meet the requirements set on personal image and musical behaviour in concert activities within different contexts.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show good direction towards the ability to have a dialogue with other artists.

Course content

The course can contain presentations, individual work, guest visits, study visits and lectures.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of projects, individually planned activities and lectures. Attendance is compulsory for projects within the education.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through presentations and continuous assessment. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
