Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show a basic technical ability on the instrument and
- when playing, show a basic understanding of the style and expressions of the current repertoire.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show the ability to study and carry out artistic assignments and also
- show the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show the ability to have a dialogue with other artists.

Course content

The content of the course is based on the individual student's needs. Together with the faculty management the student makes an individual study plan in which is placed strong emphasis on the student's needs and vision for musical development and direction. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUF80.

Course design

The course consists of individual lessons, individual work (practicing, preparations, projects) and group studies.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
