General Information

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Music: Arranging/Composition Jazz Style, first cycle 180 credits.

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have good direction towards a broad knowledge of arranging/composition for larger and smaller ensembles within traditional as well as modern jazz,
- have good direction towards a developed ability to analyse and describe different musical forms, structures and contents and also

- have good direction towards a broad knowledge of repertoire within jazz arranging and composition and also within contemporary art music, and knowledge of relevant literature.

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have good direction towards the ability to, at a developed level, create and realize own artistic thoughts and ideas and
- have good direction towards the ability to, at a developed level, meet the requirements set in professional musical life.

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have good direction towards a developed ability to make assessments considering relevant artistic aspects and
- have good direction towards a developed ability to identify the personal need for further knowledge and skill development.

Course content

The course can include the study of works by important arrangers/composers from the different epochs of jazz with regard to for example form, harmony, composition and arranging technique. The course can also include the application of these studies in own works; analysis of jazz harmony, partly by means of traditional methods (function and chord analysis, roman numeral analysis); melody studies applied in own compositions; notation of scores and parts. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUG71.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons, group lessons, seminars, guest lectures and individual work (analysis, arranging, composition and presentation assignments).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.
