Details of approval

General Information

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Church Music: first cycle 180 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of studies

Music

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show developed knowledge of musical form and structure and also
- show developed knowledge of harmonic and four part writing principles in music from different epochs.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- have the ability to critically reflect on the personal artistic approach and
- have the ability to independently carry out artistic assignments within the field of arranging and composition.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• have the ability to have a constructive dialogue with other artists.

Course content

The main specialisation of the course is vocal music: arranging and composition exercises. Continued analysis assignments. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUH21.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons and group lessons, seminars and individual work (practicing, preparation).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and final tests. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with

a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
