General Information

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Music: Composition, Arranging/Composition Classical Style, first cycle 180 credits.

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have a broad knowledge of instrumental playing technique,
- have a broad knowledge of how to use instruments in compositions and arrangements for different ensemble types such as orchestras and chamber music ensembles, homogeneous as well as not homogeneous,

- have a broad knowledge of translation problems such as transcribing piano music for orchestra and
- have a broad knowledge of the history, development and different aesthetic directions of instrumentation.

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the student shall

- have acquired a broad ability to transform acquired knowledge of instrumentation into artistic tools for personal music creating.

Course content

The course mainly consists of relevant literature on the subject, scores and other music material, compendiums as well as listening material and recordings of different kinds. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUL84.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of group lessons and individual work (exercises, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
