Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2017-11-29 and was last revised on 2022-06-08. The revised syllabus applies from 2022-08-29, autumn semester 2022.

General Information

Compulsory course in Master's Programme in Music: Symphony Orchestra Instruments, second cycle 120 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish and English

Main field of studies

Music

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements AXX, Second cycle, in-depth level of the course cannot be classified

Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- have very good knowledge of different musical styles and their performance practices and concert traditions,
- have a very good ability to co-operate with others in joint projects and

ensembles,

- have a very good ability to use own impulses and at the same time interact in groups and ensembles and also
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- have a very good ability to receive and carry out instructions from ensemble leaders and orchestra leaders.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- have a very good ability to develop and critically assess own ideas and critically review own and others' viewpoints,
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- have a very good ability to create and realize own as well as shared artistic ideas and visions,
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- have a very good ability to meet the requirements set on personal image and musical performance in concert activities in different contexts and also
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- have a very good ability to think and act flexibly and to adapt to changes and new circumstances.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• have a very good ability to identify personal needs for skill development.

Course content

The course content is determined by the preconditions that follow repertoire and ensemble type and are specific to the instrument. The course mainly consists of certain works from the orchestra repertoire for the instrument.

Course design

The course is usually carried out in the form of orchestra projects with rehearsals and concerts (musical studies, own rehearsal work). It could also be in the form of group lessons, seminars, and workshops/master classes.

At the start of the study year the students shall be informed which weeks the orchestra projects are conducted. It is compulsory to be available to participate in all of these projects. The selection of students ahead of each project is done by teachers for each instrument/group of instruments.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and, in applicable cases, project presentations. Examination rules and mark limits shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course or module shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

In addition to general entry requirements for higher education at second cycle level the following specific entry requirements are applied: Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Master's Programme in Music.
