Compulsory course in Master's Programme in Music: Jazz Improvisation, second cycle 120 credits

Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards excellent craftsmanship,
- show good direction towards broad knowledge within the main field of study,

- show good direction towards considerably deepened knowledge and understanding of part or parts of the main field of study, including insight in current research and development work, and
- show good direction towards deepened knowledge of artistic processes in general and own working methods in particular.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to critically reflect on the personal artistic approach, and that of others, within a wider artistic context,
- show good direction towards the ability to independently identify, formulate and solve artistic problems and problems regarding interpretation,
- show good direction towards the ability to create and realize own artistic ideas with a developed personal expression and also
- show good direction towards the ability to plan, and with adequate methods carry out, qualified artistic assignments within given time frames.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to, within the main field of study, make assessments considering relevant artistic, social and ethical aspects and also
- show good direction towards the ability to identify the personal need for further knowledge and take responsibility for the personal knowledge development.

Course content

Together with the course coordinator the student makes an individual planning of the course content in relation to the aims and has a great possibility to influence the contents of the course and to create a personal profile. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUV11.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons, individual work (practicing, preparations, projects), and group studies. Together with the course coordinator the student makes an individual study plan in which strong emphasis is put on the student's needs and vision for personal musical development and direction.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and exams/tests. Examination rules, such as e.g. examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

In addition to general entry requirements for higher education at second cycle level the following specific entry requirements are applied:

Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Bachelor's Programme in Music.
