NEKP01, Economics: Master Essay II, 15 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The Board of the Department of Economics on 2011-06-07 and was valid from 2011-06-07, autumn semester 2011.

General Information

This is a single subject master course in economics. The course is either obligatory or optional within a number of master programmes at Lund University.

Tuition is given in Swedish or English.

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

Students shall demonstrate:

- an understanding of advanced theories and models in the chosen area,
- knowledge of relevant empirical methods to analyse the chosen issue,
- an understanding of the relevant theories and methods to analyse the problem of the essay.

Competence and skills

Students shall have the ability to independently:

- apply advanced theories and models in the chosen area,
- apply relevant empirical methods to analyse the chosen issue,
- draw relevant conclusions from the analysis undertaken,

- adopt a critical and scientific approach,
- account for and discuss the analysis undertaken in writing in a structured and scieitific manner,
- adequately summarise the content of the essay and the most important conclusions, in speech and in writing,
- present and discuss the essay at a seminar,
- evaluate and discuss other essays.

Judgement and approach

Students shall develop:

- an ability to identify relevant research issues with a high degree of independence,
- an ability to initiate and undertake a scientific investigation with a high degree of independence,
- an ability to seek, evaluate, analyse and critically examine information with a high degree of independence,
- a scientific approach.

Course content

The course consists of writing an essay that is publicly defended at a seminar with a discussant and to discuss another essay at a seminar. The essay shall be written individually or by two students writing together. In the process of writing, the student is advised by one or more tutors. The course starts with some gatherings for general information on writing essays and seeking information through the library.

Course design

1. Teaching: In the beginning of the course, there are some meetings. The course is ended by seminars. Apart from this, tuition consists of individual supervision.

At the start of an essay, the student states what seminar period the essay shall be presented. If an essay has not been presented at the latest two seminar periods after the stated seminar period, the student does not have the right to further supervision unless there are exceptional circumstances. If an essay has been presented but failed at two attempts, the student does not have the right to further supervision unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Assessment

1. Examination: Examination consists of writing the essay, presenting the essay at a seminar, discussing another essay and actively participating in at least three other seminars. Individual performance during the work on the essay can affect the grade. The grade is decided by an examiner and not the supervisor. The essay must be provided to the database of the Economic Library in order to pass the course.

2. Limitations on the number of examination opportunities: -

The University views plagiarism very seriously, and will take disciplinary action against students for any kind of attempted malpractice in connection with examinations and assessments. Plagiarism is considered to be a very serious academic offence. The

penalty that may be imposed for this, and other unfair practices in examinations or assessments, includes suspension from the University for a specified period.

Entry requirements

At least 75 ECTS-credits in economics at the advanced level are required. These must include Master Essay I (*e.g.* NEKN01) or an equivalent course.

5. Limitations in renewed examination: When an essay is presented and get the grade Fail, the student may revise the essay. When the grade Fail is awarded, the examiner shall decide if the revision is of a nature that the essay will havet o be presented at a new seminar of if it is sufficient to hand in the revised version. Essays that require a new seminar shall be handed in within a year. This means that the essay shall be handed in at the corresponding seminar period the year after at the latest. Essays that do not require a new seminar shall be handed in within six month after the grade Fail was awarded. Essays that receive the grade Fail for the second time shall be handed in a revised version within three months after the grade Fail was awarded. For all later versions, the same rules apply as for essays that received the grade Fail for the second time.
