Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2018-09-13 to be valid from 2018-09-13, autumn semester 2018.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Danish

The course is normally taught by Danish-speaking teachers. Required reading and instructions are in Danish. Students can speak and write in Swedish or Danish.

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the main features of the development of children's and young adult literature in Denmark from 1940 onward
- identify and account for the typical genres, themes, motifs and narrative techniques of children's and young adult literature
- account for some key Danish authors of children's and young adult literature
- account for the variable views on children expressed in modern Danish children's and young adult literature

• account for different educational, aesthetic, moral and ideological trends in modern Danish children's and young adult literature

Competence and skills

- use basic analytical tools within literature studies to analyse Danish children's and young adult literature
- analyse genre, themes, motifs and narrative techniques of individual texts
- analyse and compare the representation of identity in different texts

Judgement and approach

• use a scholarly approach to discuss and provide perspectives on how gender, ethnicity and cultural diversity are expressed in contemporary Danish children's and young adult literature.

Course content

On the course, students will study Danish children's and young adult literature from 1940 until the present, focusing on texts of recent years. Some key Danish authors of children's and young adult literature are presented and studied. The students work with texts in different genres in contemporary children's literature, such as picture-books, cartoons, adventure/fantasy, lyric poetry, realism, "raw" social realism and migration literature. Basic tools of literary analysis are used and texts are analysed with regard to genres, themes, motifs and narrative technique as well as in relation to gender, ethnicity, social class and generation, among other aspects. The variable views of children in children's and young adult literature are presented and analysed. Different educational, aesthetic, moral and ideological trends in modern Danish children's and young adult literature are examined and discussed.

Course design

The course usually takes place as independent study with an initial lecture and supervision during the course. However, lectures and seminars may occur.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a final written exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
