## NODK01, Danish: Level 3 - B.A. course, 30 credits

*Danska: Kandidatkurs, 30 högskolepoäng*

First Cycle / Grundnivå

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### Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-01-24 and was last revised on 2015-05-22. The revised syllabus applied from 2015-05-22, spring semester 2015.

### General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree. The course is compulsory for a degree of Bachelor in Danish.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- provide a specialised account of selected parts of the main field of Danish
- account for basic theory of science and research methods focusing on central aspects for the study of literature and linguistics
- account for current research issues within the subject of Danish

#### Competence and skills

- independently seek, collect and critically interpret relevant information
- independently discern, formulate and discuss research problems from different aspects and suggest solutions

- informed by a solid theoretical understanding of literature and linguistics, identify and apply theories and method for a selected research issue
- independently execute a simple research assignment within the main field of Danish and within a predetermined time frame report it in an academic paper that complies with the conventions of academic writing
- assess their own and others' solutions of research issues and adopt a scholarly approach to language and literature
- use varied spoken and written Danish adapted to the situation

### **Judgement and approach**

- identify their need of further knowledge to develop their skills in Danish
- discuss and evaluate the status of linguistics and literature in the academic community and the role of research for citizens and society at large with good support

### **Course content**

The course includes an introduction to linguistic and literary theories and methods and an elective module that enables students to achieve specialisation or breadth in their knowledge and skills. The elective module normally consists of Classics of Danish Literature, but if the student has already passed this module they can select another relevant course. Furthermore, the course includes a degree project that can specialise in linguistics or literature. The degree project is to be written in Danish.

The course consists of the following modules: ?

1. Classics of Danish Literature, 7.5 credits, or another relevant elective course of 7.5 credits,
2. Theories and Methods of Linguistics and Literature, 7.5 credits,
3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

### **Course design**

The teaching consists of exercises, lectures and seminars. It is assumed that the student has access to a computer with internet connection. At the beginning of the course, information about the technical requirements is provided. The course includes 6-8 compulsory assessed seminars.

### **Assessment**

The module Classics of Danish Literature is assessed partly on the basis of 5 compulsory assignments (to be presented orally) and partly on the basis of a written exam at the end of the course.

The module Theories and Methods of Linguistics and Literature is assessed on the basis of 3-5 assignments to be presented orally and in writing during the course and of a final take-home exam.

The degree project is assessed on the basis of a paper that is discussed at a seminar. The student's defence of their own degree project and critical review of a fellow student's project is included in the assessment.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

## **Grades**

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the degree project.

## **Entry requirements**

To be admitted to the course, students must have 60 credits in Danish (NODA12 and NODA23, Danish Level 2, 30 credits or the equivalent).

## **Further information**

1. The course is offered at the the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
2. Module 1 can also be taken as a freestanding course (Classics of Danish Literature NODB13). Module 2 is also included as a module in SSLK01 Swedish-Language and Literature, Level 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
