#### General Information

Subject: Nordic Languages

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

### Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the basic structural features of contemporary lcelandic (pronunciation, inflection and word formation, and syntax)
- be able to utilise the key vocabulary of simple everyday contemporary Icelandic

#### Competence and skills

• be able to read and translate simple Icelandic texts, with the help of dictionaries and other aids

• be able to write simple texts in coherent Icelandic, with the help of dictionaries and other aids.

#### Course content

The course gives an introduction to contemporary Icelandic. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension and vocabulary, and to a certain extent on written proficiency. The structure of the Icelandic language is also discussed.

### Course design

Teaching consists of exercises, lectures, and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

#### Assessment

The following examination forms can occur: oral and/or written tests at the end of each sub-course, continuous assessment in the form of home assignments, essays and seminars.
