The syllabus was approved by Deputy Dean of Education at the School of Economics and Management on 2020-11-23 and was last revised on 2020-11-23 by Academic Director of Studies at Department of Business Administration. The revised syllabus applies from 2020-11-23, autumn semester 2021.

Learning outcomes

With this course, the student will gain a deeper understanding of public organizations' conditions, characteristics and challenges in Scandinavia. The theoretical starting point is about governance and management of public organizations and how Public management has been applied and developed. The course also aims to train the application of these concepts in different type situations and activities.

A passing grade on the course will be awarded to students who:

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the main theoretical perspectives in Public Management
- can show understanding of the historical background of different theories and the most important concepts, models and tools.
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding regarding the specific institutional conditions under which public organizations operate.

Competence and skills

- demonstrate an ability to apply theories regarding governance and management within public organizations, taking into account the specific context in Scandinavia
- demonstrate an ability to convincingly present theoretically based analysis and nuanced conclusions.

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate an ability to integrate relevant theories from the course and draw nuanced conclusions.
- demonstrate an ability to competently and convincingly make recommendations for development initiatives regarding governance and management of public organizations in a specific context.

Course content

The course begins with an overview of the historical development in governance and management of public activities in Scandinavia. Furthermore, the course discusses and analyzes conditions, characteristics and challenges of public organizations in Scandinavia. The development of public management, how it has been applied in recent decades and its critique are also discussed. A critical approach is practised through applications of different concepts in practical situations (cases) ..

Course design

The course consists of lectures, workshops and student presentations. The approach to the course is based on a so-called "flipped classroom" where students work outside school to prepare classroom exercises (independent as well as teacher-led) and activities led by the teacher. The course structure is further described in the course instructions (distributed separately).

Assessment

Assessment and grading are based on two parts:

One or more individual written paper that focus on the student's understanding of and ability to reflect on core concepts and models of the course.

One or more group assignments presented and discussed in class. The focus is on the ability to apply and discuss the content of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

Grade (Definition) Points or % out of maximum points. Characteristic.

A (Excellent) 85-100. A distinguished result that is excellent with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought.

B (Very good) 75-84. A very good result with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought.

C (Good) 65-74. The result is of a good standard with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought and lives up to expectations.

D (Satisfactory) 55-64. The result is of a satisfactory standard with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought.

E (Sufficient) 50-54. The result satisfies the minimum requirements with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought, but not more.

F (U) (Fail) 0-49. The result does not meet the minimum requirements with regard to theoretical depth, practical relevance, analytical ability and independent thought.

Some occasional examination elements of the course may have the grading scale pass (D) / fail U(F).

The penalty that may be imposed for this, and other improper practices in examinations or assessments, includes suspension from the University for a specific period of time.
