# POLA21, Polish: Level 2, 30 credits Polska: Fortsättningskurs, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

## Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

## **General Information**

Subject: Polish. The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Polish and Swedish

Main field of studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

#### Knowledge and understanding

- be able to understand and give an account of the contents of a moderately difficult Polish text
- be able to understand a Polish speaker talking about everyday subjects and be able to communicate, interpret and convey information in Polish

### Competence and skills

- be able to write detailed and coherent texts in Polish that are accurate, polished and correct, and in a variety of subject areas
- be able to give an oral presentation of a prepared subject matter or area of interest and to be able to develop and substantiate parts of the presentation with additional information
- be able to apply relevant theories and methods to the composition of a scholarly text in a chosen area of specialisation, i.e. Polish literature or Polish linguistics
- be able to write a text that conforms to rules regarding footnotes, works cited, documentation of sources etc.
- be able to seek information on the subject in the chosen field of specialisation

#### Judgement and approach

- be able to analyse Polish phonetics and grammar from a contrastive perspective
- be able to evaluate scholarly information from various sources and, in his/her field of specialisation, be able to assess the nature and quality of that information.

#### Course content

The course provides in-depth practice in oral and written (stylistic) proficiency, and knowledge of the Polish language from a comparative perspective.

As part of the course the student is expected to execute an autonomous scholarly study in a subject chosen in consultation with his/her supervisor and in one of the two specialist fields of literature or linguistics. The result is presented in an essay of approximately 20-25 pages which is discussed at a seminar.

The course consists of the following two sub-courses:

- 1. Polish Language Proficiency III, 15 credits
- 2. Polish Literature, 15 credits, or Polish Linguistics, 15 credits.

### Course design

Teaching takes the form of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

#### Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations, written assignments, continuous assessment as part of the lectures, seminars and practical exercises.

### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all subcourses. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Pass with Distinction for at least 20 of the 30 higher education credits on the course and the grade of Pass on the remainder of the This is a translation of the course syllabus approved in Swedish

## Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of POLA11, or the equivalent.
