POLB01, Polish: Introduction to Polish, 15 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

Subject: Polish The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the main theoretical features of both general and Polish phonetics
- be able to give an account of the key elements of general grammar
- be able to identify some of the most common paradigms and grammatical structures in the Polish language
- be able to understand and give an account of the contents of a simplified Polish text
- be able to understand a Polish speaker who speaks slowly and clearly, and talks about known subjects

Competence and skills

- be able to formulate simple, everyday phrases in Polish, conduct a simple conversation in known situations, and follow and understand simple phrases
- be able to ask simple questions, answer everyday questions expressed in noncomplex grammatical forms, and interpret and understand what is said in a simple conversation in Polish
- be able to write simple sentences in Polish about everyday subjects.

Course content

The course provides the students with basic knowledge of the grammatical and phonetic structures of the Polish language and an insight into Polish culture. The students practise their ability to read simplified texts and to apply in practice the phonetic rules and most common grammatical structures and everyday phrases of Polish.

The course consists of the following three sub-courses:

- 1. Polish Morphology and General Grammar, 5 credits,
- 2. Reading Proficiency, 5 credits,
- 3. Oral Proficiency, General and Polish Phonetics, 5 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations and continuous assessment as part of the lectures, seminars and exercises.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all subcourses. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Pass with Distinction for at least 10 of the 15 higher education credits on the course and the grade of Pass on the remainder of the course.

- 2. This course also constitutes a sub-course in POLA11.
