POLB03, Polish: Language Proficiency II, 15 credits Polska: Språkfärdighet II, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

Subject: Polish The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Polish and Swedish

Main field of studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to understand and identify the most important grammatical and syntactic differences between Polish and Swedish
- be able to understand and give an account of the contents of an elementary Polish text
- be able to understand a Polish speaker who speaks clearly and talks about everyday subjects.

Competence and skills

- be able to apply key elements of Polish grammar in speech and in writing
- be able to express feelings and desires in Polish, relate a fictive or real event and speak Polish with such lexical and grammatical correctness that there is no problem for an outsider to understand the student in prepared situations
- be able to understand the content of simple fiction and non-fiction texts in a given subject, find, understand and give an account of relevant information in everyday material such as letters, brochures and short official documents
- be able to translate simple texts containing only the most common words from Polish to Swedish and vice versa.

Course content

The course provides practice in oral and written proficiency, and basic knowledge of the Polish language from a comparative perspective.

The course consists of the following three sub-courses:

- 1. Polish Grammar, 6 credits,
- 2. Written Proficiency and Reading Comprehension, 4.5 credits,
- 3. Oral Proficiency, 4.5 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations, written assignments, continuous assessment as part of the lectures, seminars and practical exercises.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all subcourses. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Pass with Distinction for at least 9 of the 15 higher education credits on the course and the grade of Pass on the remainder of the course.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of POLB02, or the equivalent.

- 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
