POLB20, Polish: Beginners' Course 2, 15 credits Polska: Nybörjarkurs II, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-06-12 to be valid from 2023-09-01, spring semester 2024.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Language of instruction: Swedish and English Teaching is conducted in English or Swedish and Polish.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- •identify key declension patterns in Polish,
- •understand and identify the most important Polish cultural codes,
- •use sufficient vocabulary to communicate in most everyday situations,

Competence and skills

- speak Polish while utilising the most basic rules for Polish pronunciation,
- apply key Polish declension patterns and constructions in both speech and

writing,

- use everyday phrases and follow and actively participate in common communication situations about different known subjects or areas,
- produce simple texts in Polish using the most basic Polish grammar and writing rules,

Judgement and approach

• review, discuss and take a position on linguistic and cultural norms.

Course content

The course provides students with further training in vocabulary and grammatical structures in Polish through studies of simplified texts. The course aims to provide both language proficiency training and advanced knowledge of the Polish language, society and everyday life.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Polish Grammar and Text Study II, 7.5 credits
- 2. Oral and Written Proficiency II, 7.5 credits

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars and exercises.

Both modules include compulsory components: Module 1: 3-6 compulsory written assignments. Module 2: 3-6 compulsory written assignments.

Opportunities to compensate for compulsory components are offered in consultation with the course director.

Assessment

Module 1 is assessed through a written exam. Module 2 is assessed through an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have completed Polish: Beginners' Course 1 (POLB10) or the equivalent.
