Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2015-12-11 and was last revised on 2016-12-07. The revised syllabus applies from 2017-01-16, spring semester 2017.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. It can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Course content

The course is an introduction to the sociology of religion, focusing on the emergence and historical development of the discipline. It deals with a few theories of the sociology of religion and methods of sociology, and the links between their emergence and changes in society. The theories and methods are exemplified by means of current studies on contemporary social phenomena.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a take-home exam and an oral exam.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have passed Religious Studies and Theology: Level 1 (CTRA12/CTRD12/CTRA11/CTRD01) or History of Religions: Level 1 (RHIA12/RHIA11) or Islamic Studies: Level 1 (ISLA11) or Jewish Studies: Level 1 (JUDA11) or 30 credits in sociology or the equivalent.
