Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2016-05-23 and was last revised on 2023-03-09. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-15, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It may be included in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. It may be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a structured account of the most important methods for material and data collection in the field of religious studies

Competence and skills

- independently and critically interpret results derived from different methods of religious studies and present them in speech and writing
- perceive, formulate and discuss research problems from different perspectives and different methodological traditions
- independently select and apply suitable methods for a study according to a predetermined standard

Judgement and approach

- assess the knowledge produced by religious studies and the researcher's responsibility for how it is used.

Course content

The course provides students with an overview of and application exercise in methods that are used in research within religious behavioural science, philology and the anthropology of religions. The student is also enabled to practise some of these methods in depth. The course provides students with an awareness of the importance of methods, issues of research ethics and the choice of method for a specific research assignment.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars in which the students is expected to participate actively with presentations and discussions.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a take-home exam of approximately 15 pages.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have passed History of Religions and Religious Behavioural Science: Level 2 (RHBB03) **and** History of Religions: Level 2 (RHIB13) or Islamology: Level 2 (ISLB13) or Jewish Studies: Level 2 (JUDB13) or Religious Behavioural Science: Level 2 (RBVB13) **or** the equivalent.

3. The course is included as a module in the courses ISLK03, JUDK03, RBVK03, RHIK03.
