# RHIB25, History of Religions: Anthropology of Religions, 7.5 credits

# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2012-02-22 and was last revised on 2014-11-28 by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology. The revised syllabus applies from 2015-01-19, spring semester 2015.

## **General Information**

The course can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. The course is also offered as a freestanding course and can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

## Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- provide a general account of basic theories and methods of the anthropology of religion
- account for the role of symbols, cosmologies, myths and rituals in both ceremonial and everyday life

#### Competence and skills

- analyse in speech and writing fieldwork within the anthropology of religion through case studies
- independently reflect on and account in writing for issues of fieldwork as a method

#### Judgement and approach

- critically review and analyse issues of power, gender or ethnicity within the field of the anthropology of religion
- assess the role of self-reflection within the anthropology of religion

#### Course content

The course introduces theories and methods of the anthropology of religion and the documentation of religious life in anthropological fieldwork. The role of symbols, cosmologies, myths and rituals in both ceremonial and everyday life is also examined. Students review case studies from different fields as examples of fieldwork in the anthropology of religion.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and approximately three compulsory seminars. Students can make up for missed seminars through written assignments in accordance with the lecturer's instructions.

#### Assessment

The assessment is based on oral presentations at the seminars and on a final written home assignment.

# Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all assessed components. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the home assignment and passed the remaining components.

## Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed: Religious Studies Level 1, 30 credits, (CTRA10) or 30 credits from higher education including 15 credits in the history of religions or the equivalent.
