

RUMA02, Romanian: Level 1 - Online Course, 30 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-10-26 and was last revised on 2025-09-11 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2025/458). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2025-09-11 and is valid from the spring semester 2026.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

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Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- describe, using appropriate terminology, key elements of Romanian grammar
- describe different areas of Romanian culture and society.

Competence and skills

- express themselves in Romanian, in speech and writing, correctly and informally
- read and translate written modern Romanian

- clarify and apply key elements of Romanian grammar
- use grammar and bilingual dictionaries in order to read and write Romanian.

Judgement and approach

- identify their own need for additional knowledge in the subject
- discern and assess cultural phenomena in Romanian society from a national and European perspective.

Course content

The course provides extended training in grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, listening comprehension and speaking skills as well as a deeper insight into the geography, history and culture of Romania and the Romanian language.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Written Proficiency, 9 credits,
2. Oral Proficiency, 6 credits,
3. Text Study, 9 credits,
4. Life and Institutions, 6 credits.

Course design

Teaching consists of online texts, exercises and audio files, tutorials and group discussions. The teaching is entirely in the form of distance learning and uses interactive information technology. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection and a web camera. The department will provide information about technical requirements.

Assessment

Module 1 is examined through a camera-monitored written exam using real-time streaming

Module 2 is examined through a camera-monitored oral exam using real-time streaming.

Module 3 is examined through a camera-monitored written exam using real-time streaming.

Module 4 is examined through a camera-monitored oral exam using real-time streaming.

Camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording takes place. Monitoring in real time is required in order to assess the student's knowledge without the student having access to aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For the grade of Pass, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 21 credits and at least the grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

Access to the course requires RUMA01 or equivalent knowledge.
