Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2025-12-10 (U 2025/954). The syllabus comes into effect 2026-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2026.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Romanian

Main field of study *Specialisation*

Romanian G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- explain in Swedish the structure of the Romanian language
- present in Swedish the history of Romanian literature from the 20th century
- explain in Swedish the basic concepts of Romanian and general linguistics.

Competence and skills

- use a vocabulary consisting of words and expressions in the standard Romanian language
- actively participate in conversations and discussions in Romanian

- apply Romanian grammar in speech and writing
- translate short texts from Romanian into Swedish and from Swedish into Romanian
- write short texts in Romanian
- read and analyse in Romanian a couple of Romanian classic literary works from the 20th century.

Judgement and approach

- assess their own need for further theoretical and advanced knowledge in the subject
- discuss Romanian texts from different perspectives and take a position on issues relating to ethnicity and cultural encounters.

Course content

The Level 2 Romanian course builds on the basic level and deepens the student's competence in Romanian through advanced studies in grammar, translation and oral proficiency as well as an introduction to Romanian literature and linguistics. Teaching includes work on complex grammatical structures, idiomatic expressions and the translation of more demanding texts, as well as in-depth oral interaction through argumentation, thematic presentations and analytical dialogues. Through the study of classical literary works and basic literary studies methods, students develop their ability to interpret and contextualise texts, while elements of general and Romanian linguistics provide a better understanding of the phonological, morphological and syntactic characteristics of the language. The course thus provides integrated and broad progression in the subject that prepares students for further academic studies in Romanian.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Romanian Grammar and Translation, 7.5 credits,
2. Oral Proficiency, 7.5 credits,
3. Romanian Literature and Literary Analysis, 9 credits,
4. Introduction to General and Romanian Linguistics, 6 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of online lectures, group exercises and individual exercises. A minimum of 50% attendance is required for a grade of Pass on the course. Additional information must be provided in the case of further absences.

The teaching is entirely in the form of distance learning and uses interactive information technology. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection and a web camera. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

Assessment

Module 1 is examined through three individual written assignments and a camera-monitored written exam using real-time streaming.

Module 2 is examined through a camera-monitored oral exam using real-time streaming.

Module 3 is examined through a compulsory written assignment and a camera-monitored oral exam using real-time streaming.

Module 4 is examined through a camera-monitored written exam using real-time streaming.

Camera monitoring takes place in real time. Monitoring in real time is required in order to assess the student's knowledge without the student having access to aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

Module 1: A grade of Pass requires this grade on the three written assignments and on the written exam. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must also have been awarded this grade on the written exam.

Module 3: A grade of Pass requires this grade on the written assignment and on the oral exam. For a grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have been awarded this grade on the written assignment and on the oral exam.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on at least 21 of the course credits.

Entry requirements

General entry requirements and Romanian language: Level 1 course (RUMA12), 30 credits, or equivalent knowledge.
