Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2014-01-16 and was last revised by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-03-14 (U 2024/165). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2024-03-14 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Main field of Specialisation study

Romanian G2E, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements, contains degree project for Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Science

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- describe some of the most important works and authorships in Romanian literature,
- give an account of the scientific basis and central scientific methods in the subject of Romanian,
- give an account of some applicable research methods in modern Romanian,
- in their subject area orient themselves and give an account of current research questions

Competence and skills

- write, review and defend a scientific degree project in Romanian,
- use Romanian in speech and writing to critically analyse and report information,
- read and give an account of various types of newer and older Romanian texts,
- apply a scientific methodology and assess and evaluate different texts in Romanian,
- discuss questions that concern different linguistic theories,

Judgement and approach

- make assessments taking into account relevant scholarly, social, and ethical aspects,
- search, collect and evaluate relevant information for example by using information technology resources,
- identify their own need for additional knowledge in Romanian.

Course content

In the course, the written and oral skills are further deepened. Special emphasis is placed on writing texts of an argumentative and scientific nature in Romanian. The course also gives insight into current theories and methods in Romanian linguistics.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Oral and Written Proficiency, 6 credits,
2. Text, 9 credits,
3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

The course is offered entirely as a distance learning course, supported by an online virtual learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection. The department will provide information about technical requirements.

Assessment

The course is assessed in the following way at the end of each module: module 1 through written and oral examination, module 2 through a written assignment and oral examination, and module 3 through degree project and critical review.

It is recommended that degree projects awarded a grade of Pass at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology be registered in the LUP Student Papers database. The student is responsible for ensuring that the version of the degree project that has been assessed and approved is the one uploaded to LUP Student Papers (in PDF format).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For the grade of pass, the student must have been awarded this grade for all modules. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction, students must have been awarded this grade on 15 credits and at least the grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires the overview RUMA03 or equivalent knowledge.
