# RYSA24, Russian: Text Study and Translation from Russian into Swedish II, 7.5 credits

# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-04-18 to be valid from 2017-04-18, autumn semester 2017.

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

• describe the structure of Russian from a contrastive perspective

## Competence and skills

- translate fiction and non-fiction texts of a varying nature into Swedish appropriate to the context
- analyse Russian syntax from a contrastive perspective
- identify and analyse style variations in modern Russian writing

## Judgement and approach

• critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms, and adopt a scholarly approach to language.

#### Course content

The course includes knowledge-oriented components that enable students to develop their understanding of the grammatical structure of Russian, through a contrastive focus on its relation to the structure of Swedish. The teaching mainly consists of exercises in practical reading comprehension. The texts in Russian are selected so as to provide students with both language proficiency and knowledge about Russian history, culture and society.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and group assignments, in which elements of peer review may be included. Approximately 5 seminars are compulsory.

#### Assessment

The assessment is based on a written invigilated exam in Russian fiction, a written invigilated exam in Russian non-fiction, and 2–4 written assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of assessment if it cannot be implemented during a re-examination, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

## Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the students must must have been awarded this grade on all assessed components.

# Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed RYSA01 or the equivalent.
