Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-03-23 to be valid from 2022-03-23, autumn semester 2022.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

• describe and discuss the contents of Russian texts of varying nature and register,

Competence and skills

- apply key parts of Russian grammar in speech and writing,
- participate actively in a conversation in standard Russian, even when they are not familiar with the topic discussed,

- prepare and give long presentations in Russian,
- express themselves in both spoken and written Russian in a way that is more grammatically and lexically correct and nuanced than on the level 1 course,

Judgement and approach

• critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms, and adopt a scholarly approach to language.

Course content

The course consists of practice in language proficiency (with a focus on written and oral production) at a more advanced level compared to the level 1 course in Russian. The selection of material is made to give students a specialised insight into both the cultural history and current public debate of Russia.

Course design

The course consists of lectures, seminars and exercises.

Assessment

The assessment is based on 2–4 written assignments, two talks and an oral exam at the end of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the students must have been awarded this grade on 80 % of all components.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed RYSA12 and RYSA15 or the equivalent.

- 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
