

## **RYSB01, Russian: Elementary Course I, 15 credits**

*Ryska: Nybörjarkurs I, 15 högskolepoäng*

**First Cycle / Grundnivå**

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### **Details of approval**

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-06-19 and was last revised on 2024-06-07 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology ( U 2024/452). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2024-09-01 and is valid from the spring semester 2025.

### **General information**

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- identify certain common declension patterns and grammatical constructions in Russian
- understand and account for the contents of simplified Russian texts and dialogues,

## Competence and skills

- read Russian texts aloud with correct pronunciation that allows for good comprehension
- apply certain common lexical and grammatical constructions in speech and writing
- translate into Russian and correctly spell words that occur in set texts
- to some extent speak Russian in everyday situations

## Judgement and approach

- critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms

## Course content

The course is based on a study of simplified dialogues and texts in Russian with elementary vocabulary and basic grammatical structures. The course also includes simple written exercises and role play of everyday situations. Furthermore, students practise Russian pronunciation and oral proficiency in connection with exercises in listening comprehension, pronunciation and conversation.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Russian Beginners' Course 1A, 7.5 credits,
2. Russian Beginners' Course 1B, 7.5 credits.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons, exercises and 10-12 mandatory short written assignments.

Submission of all written assignments and at least 50 % attendance is mandatory. Completion takes place in the form of oral or written assessment of missed components.

## Assessment

Module 1 is assessed on the basis of a written and an oral exam.

Module 2 is assessed on the basis of a written and an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

## Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules
