RYSE01, Russian: Work Placement Abroad, 30 credits Ryska: Utlandspraktik, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-08-25 to be valid from 2011-08-25, autumn semester 2011.

General Information

Subject: Russian

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included in a firstor second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English, Swedish and Russian

Main field of studies	Depth of study relative to the degree requirements
-	G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to describe their work in the country of the target language and the routines at a Swedish authority or company abroad
- be able to account for the type of generic skills that can be useful for work at a Swedish authority or company abroad

Competence and skills

- be able to master the formal registers of Russian
- be able to describe and reflect on the generic skills acquired during the work placement

Judgement and approach

- be able to put Russian society in perspective and compare it to Swedish circumstances
- be able to identify their need of further knowledge and develop their skills.

Course content

The course consists of a work placement at a Swedish authority or company in Russia. During the placement, students will have the opportunity to practise the formal registers of Russian in an authentic context and understand how Russian is used at a Swedish workplace in Russia.

Course design

The course consists of a work placement of 20 weeks at a Swedish authority or company in Russia.

Assessment

On completion of the placement students are to submit a report on the duties performed and a certificate from the authority/company on the nature, scope and duration of the placement.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed RYSA02 or the equivalent.

Further information

- 1. It is the responsibility of the student to find a placement position. The position must be approved by the undergraduate studies board before it can be commenced.
- 2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
