Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the board of the Centre for Gender Studies on 2015-04-14 and was last revised on 2015-04-14. The revised syllabus applies from 2015-08-31, autumn semester 2015.

The course is offered as a free-standing course.

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the students shall

demonstrate knowledge of the development of feminist and post-colonial theories on migration and citizenship

demonstrate understanding of key empirical case studies highlighting gendered and racialised dimensions of migration and citizenship

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the students shall

demonstrate the ability to understand and account for key theoretical concepts within the field of feminist and post-colonial studies of migration and citizenship

demonstrate the ability to analyse processes of migration and citizenship from a gender perspective

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, the students shall

demonstrate the ability to critically review different sources of information on migration and citizenship

Course content

The aim of the course is to provide students with basic knowledge of contemporary global migration processes and negotiations of citizenship, focusing on gender. The course deals with social, economic, political and cultural dimensions of citizenship and migration. Feminist and post-colonial approaches to the field are introduced and discussed, and issues of sexuality and reproduction in relation to citizenship are investigated.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars. Attendance at seminars is compulsory unless there are special grounds. An alternative form or date for compulsory components is offered to students who are not able to complete a compulsory component owing to circumstances beyond their control, e.g. accident, sudden illness or similar. This also applies to students who have missed teaching because of activities as a student representative.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a take-home exam and written assignments. Three opportunities for examination are offered in conjunction with the course: a first examination and two re-examinations. Within a year of the end of the course, two further re-examinations on the same course content are offered. After this, further re-examination opportunities are offered but in accordance with the current course syllabus.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

The grades awarded are A, B, C, D, E or Fail.

The highest grade is A, and the lowest passing grade is E. The grade for a non-passing result is Fail. The student's performance is assessed with reference to the learning outcomes of the course. For the grade of E the student must show acceptable results. For the grade of D the student must show satisfactory results. For the grade of C the student must show good results. For the grade of B the student must show very good results. For the grade of A the student must show excellent results. For the grade of Fail the student must have shown unacceptable results. At the start of the course

students are informed about the learning outcomes stated in the syllabus and about the grading scale and how it is applied in the course.
