General Information

Subject: Ethnology

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

- be able to recognise, describe and problematise issues relating to differences and similarities in daily life in Europe, in nationalism and in cultural heritage
- be able to relate critically to scholarly texts

Judgement and approach

• be able to assess various social phenomena from a humanist perspective.

Course content

The course deals with a number of differing situations in which the term "Europe" is used for cultural, political and other aims. The following themes will be covered: the presence of Europe in the daily lives of its inhabitants, the problem of place in Europe, nationalism in the shadow of a European construct, Europe – unity and diversity: unity in diversity? Ethnic relations, cultural heritage and the construction of cultural heritage, politics turned into culture.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of lectures, group-work and seminars. Participation in group work and seminars is obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations at the end of the sub-course, and curriculum-based continuous assessment in the form of individual or group assignments and seminars.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.
