Subject: Musicology

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

• be able to give an overview of the history of Swedish music, composers, works and musicians.

• be able to relate his/her knowledge of the history of Swedish music to various social and cultural contexts.

Course content

The student is given an orientation in the history of Swedish music from the Stone Age until today. Social and historical contexts are of central importance to this course. An emphasis is placed on classical music, jazz and rock; however, other Swedish music styles are also examined.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars and autonomous assignments.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: individual take-home examination and/or invigilated examination.
