General Information

Subject: Ethnology

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of studies

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Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give a basic account of the use of violence from a gender perspective
- be able to account for the meaning of the UN Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women, and how it is interpreted in different societies and by different groups

Competence and skills

- be able to carry out a simple scholarly analysis and to present their own and others' research results both orally and in writing
- be able to problematise the use of violence in a cultural and societal context using a cultural analysis perspective

Judgement and approach

- be able to assume a critical approach to scholarly works on violence and gender.

Course content

The course examines the use of violence in a global perspective. Various forms of violence are problematised in terms of gender and culture such as assault, sexualised violence, violence against children, honour-based violence and gang violence. The course is closely linked to current social debate.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars and group exercises. Participation in seminars and group exercises is compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on an individual written assignment at the end of the course.
Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

The highest grade is A and the lowest passing grade is E. The grade for a non-passing result is Fail.
