General Information

Subject: Rhetoric

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included in a first- or second-cycle degree.

Main field of studies Specialization

G1N, First cycle, has only uppersecondary level entry requirements

Course goal

After completing the course students should

Knowledge and understanding

- describe the working process for rhetoric
- describe fundamental concepts of cross-cultural rhetoric
- give examples of differences between rhetorical expressions in different cultures

Skills and abilities

- master basic rhetorical terminology and apply it in analysis and evaluation of communicative activities
- communicate convincingly, both as sender and receiver, in various cultural environments, e.g. in the workplace, in academia or in private situations in different countries

- provide constructive feedback on other students' oral and written work
- independently and critically analyse rhetorical communication in various media, in speech and in writing

Evaluation ability and approach

• consider ethical and intercultural aspects of rhetorical communication

Course content

On the course, students develop their rhetorical abilities, in both speech and writing, in a cross-cultural context. Teaching is based on rhetorical theory and practical application. The relationship between rhetoric and ethics is problematised in discussions on what characterises good and effective communication.

Course implementation

Teaching takes the form of lectures combined with seminars and group exercises. Attendance at seminars and group exercises is compulsory.

Course examination

The assessment is based on compulsory oral and written assignments (two of each).

Grading scale

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

Students are awarded one of the following grades: A, B, C, D, E or Fail. The highest grade is A and the lowest grade for a pass is E. Students who fail receive the grade Fail.

Entry requirements

Completed secondary education and courses corresponding to the following Swedish Upper Secondary School Programs: Mathematics A and Civics A. English A (basic) language proficiency
