General Information

Freestanding course

Language of instruction: Swedish

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to familiarize with and master a selection of common rhythms that occur in the Arabic world. After the course the student shall

- master different basic timbres on darbouka, daf and rek
- be able to play commonly occurring Arabic rhythms on above-mentioned instruments
- show skills in recognizing and name different rhythms from recordings through active music listening
- have knowledge of the names of the percussion instruments and the rhythms and their origin

Course content

- basic technique drills on darbouka, daf and rek, partly with Arabic visiting lecturer
- basic training of 10 commonly occurring Arabic rhythms on darbouka, daf or rek, partly with Arabic visiting lecturer
- music listening and video studies
- variation exercises on different rhythms

Examination takes place through a joint presentation with drum ensemble.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass. On completion of the course, one of the grades Pass or Fail is given.
