SJSB40, Nursing Fundamentals, 8 credits Omvårdnadens grunder, 8 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Nursing, Radiography, and Reproductive, Perinatal and Sexual Health Programmes Board on 2020-04-02 and was last revised on 2023-03-23. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-23, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is included as a compulsory component in the Nursing programme (180 credits). It complies with the guidelines of the Higher Education Ordinance (SFS 1993:100 with later amendments). The course integrates theory with field studies.

Language of instruction: Swedish Some components may be in English.

Main field of studies

Nursing

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary level entry requirements

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

- give an account of the four consensus concepts and other central concepts in nursing
- describe how the nurse's work is related to the nursing process
- give an account of the relevant laws and regulations related to the professional role of the nurse
- outline patient safety based on applicable national and global guidelines
- discuss sustainable development based on situations related to patient safety from a global perspective

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

- identify ethical dilemmas in clinical nursing and discuss these based on specific ethical concepts and theories
- apply the four consensus concepts and other central concepts using an approach based on nursing theory
- use databases to search for knowledge relating to nursing

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

- reflect on the development of a professional identity from an intersectional perspective
- reflect on the concept of profession in relation to their own perception of nursing as an academic profession

Key concepts within nursing Ethical concepts and theories National and global guidelines for patient safety Intersectional perspectives in nursing The philosophical and theoretical basis of nursing, care tradition and health orientation The nursing process Professional development Policy documents Patient safety Key skills

Course design

The different working methods include individual work, group assignments, peer review, field studies, seminars and lectures.

Absence from compulsory learning activities can be compensated for by other learning activities.

Assessment

All assessment is individual, based on established criteria. One regular exam and two retakes are organised for each exam/component. Students who do not achieve a Pass grade in any of these instances have the opportunity to take additional examinations. Students who fail two exam opportunities can request a change of examiner. In the case of a retake, an individual exam may replace a group exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with

a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass. Passing the course requires that all tests/components are passed and that all compulsory learning activities are completed

Entry requirements

General and courses corresponding to the following Swedish Upper Secondary School Programs: Mathematics 2, Science 2, and Social Studies 1b/1a1+1a2. (Biology 1+Chemistry 1+Physics 1a/1b1+1b2 equals Science 1+2)
