Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Spanish

Main field of studies

Spanish

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

A1N, Second cycle, has only first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of early Spanish literature
- demonstrate familiarity with linguistic theories, methods and issues
- demonstrate in-depth knowledge and understanding of his/her chosen field of specialisation for the degree project

Competence and skills

- be able to summarise, analyse and discuss both orally and in writing various areas of Spanish linguistics
- be able to formulate, resolve and report research findings from within Spanish linguistics or language teaching, using suitable scholarly terminology and within a

given timeframe

- be able to assess, summarise and evaluate information from various sources, within the chosen field of specialisation
- be able to apply his/her knowledge in the analysis of texts to write and translate texts which are precise and accurate such as, for example, scholarly texts

Judgement and approach

- be able to discuss and evaluate the place of linguistics in the academic world
- demonstrate a well-developed ability to assess his/her own work critically
- be able to relate to issues concerning gender, ethnicity and cultural encounters as well as to a general humanistic tradition of learning.

Course content

The course provides the students with in-depth knowledge of the language and literature of Early Spain and also an increased familiarity with the theories, methods and issues of literature and linguistics. It has a scholarly focus on language and literature and focuses on scholarly method. The course is completed with a degree thesis which is discussed and defended at a seminar. Oral and written language proficiency is practiced throughout the course.

The course consists of the following sub-courses:

1. Linguistic and Literary Method, 12 credits,
2. Translation from Swedish to Spanish, 3 credits,
3. Degree Thesis, 15 credits.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, tutoring, seminars and group exercises.

Assessment

The following forms of examination may occur: written tests, oral tests, submitted assignments and the degree thesis.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded the grade of Pass on the whole course the student shall have at least the grade of Pass on all sub-courses. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass with Distinction on at

least 15 of the credits on the course and a grade of Pass on any remaining credits.

The sub-courses are awarded with a grade of 1-5, where 1 is the lowest and 5 is the highest. A grade of 1 is equivalent to Fail.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course, the student must have successfully completed SPAK01, Spanish, Bachelor Degree Course, or the equivalent.

1. The course replaces SPA604.
2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
3. The course is intended both for students who intend to join the teaching profession and for those with other aims.
