# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2015-04-13 to be valid from 2015-04-13, spring semester 2015.

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- account for key issues and concepts, and theories and methods within literary studies
- provide a specialised account of the fields within Spanish literary studies that the student has particularly chosen to study

## Competence and skills

- use correct and varied spoken and written Spanish adapted to the situation, above all for discussions within literary studies
- independently and expertly formulate, solve and report a research assignment within Spanish literary studies within a predetermined time frame, applying scholarly concepts and methods

## Judgement and approach

- judge, compile and assess information from different sources for use in the degree project
- make assessments informed by relevant disciplinary, social and ethical aspects within the field of literary studies
- make a scholarly assessment of their own knowledge and skills in relation to the research field.

## Course content

The course is intended both for students specialising in Spanish for their degree in Education and for students with other specialisations. It provides students with specialised knowledge of Hispanophone literature through the study and processing of different types of text. Furthermore, students will become more familiar with the theories and methods of literary studies. Students are also to produce a degree project that is to be critically reviewed at a seminar. Throughout the course, students practise oral and written proficiency.

The elective courses are coordinated with the Master's programme in Literature, Culture and Media and are selected in consultation with the lecturer.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Elective second cycle course I specialising in literature, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Elective second cycle course II specialising in literature, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree project, 15 credits.

Students are allowed to select one elective course of 15 credits rather than two of 7.5 credits.

# Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and individual and group supervision. It is compulsory for students to defend their own degree project and critically review the degree project of a fellow student.

#### Assessment

Module 1. Elective course I is assessed in accordance with the relevant course syllabus,

Module 2: Elective course I is assessed in accordance with the relevant course syllabus,

Module 3: The degree project is assessed on the basis of the defence seminar including the critical review of a fellow student's degree project.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

## Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade of Pass on the course, the student must have been awarded at least the grade Pass on all modules. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the degree project.

# Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have passed the course Spanish: Level 3, SPAK01, Spanish III, ÄSPA51, Spanish: Level 3, SPAA03 or the equivalent.
