SPAM14, Spanish: Written Proficiency in Spanish, 7.5 credits Spanska: Skriftlig språkfärdighet i spanska, 7,5 högskolepoäng Second Cycle / Avancerad nivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-04-21 and was last revised on 2023-06-05 by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-06-05, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course and is an elective component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for key components of Spanish lexicology, syntax and morphology using contemporary and appropriate concepts
- with advanced comparative knowledge, situate Spanish in relation to Swedish or other languages

Competence and skills

- express themselves in advanced Spanish in speech and in writing
- formulate and discuss linguistic issues with regard to mediation between Spanish and Swedish primarily

• recognise different registers in Spanish

Judgement and approach

• critically review and evaluate their own Spanish texts and those of others.

Course content

The course primarily focuses on training the written language proficiency of students at an advanced level. Special attention is given to the comparison between Spanish and Swedish or, where applicable, other languages. In addition, language preservation issues and the relationship between norm and use are discussed.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, group work and individual supervision.

Attendance at at least 80% of the lectures and group exercises is compulsory.

The opportunity to compensate for or resit compulsory components will be offered to students who have been unable to participate due to circumstances out of their control such as accidents, illness or similar. This also applies to students who have missed teaching sessions because of duties as a student representative. There are otherwise no opportunities to compensate for compulsory components.

Assessment

The course assessment is based on 3 written assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass, students must have passed all written assignments. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have achieved this grade on written assignment no 2 and no 3.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have successfully completed SPAK01 or SPAA03, or the equivalent.
