Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Nursing, Radiography, and Reproductive, Perinatal and Sexual Health Programmes Board on 2020-10-28 and was last revised on 2023-09-21 (STYR 2023/1565). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2023-09-21 and is valid from the spring semester 2024.

General information

The course is included as a compulsory component in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing – Diagnostic Radiology, 180 credits and the Bachelor of Science Programme in Nursing, 180 credits. The course complies with the guidelines in the Higher Education Ordinance (SFS 1993:100 with later amendments).

Learning outcomes

Various working methods are used: Individual work, collaborative supervision, lectures and seminars. The learning activities and course content are based on learning outcomes and assessment criteria.

Assessment

All assessment is individual, based on established criteria. One regular assessment and two retakes are organised for each exam/component. Students who do not achieve a grade of Pass on one of these occasions will be offered additional opportunities for assessment. Students who receive a grade of Fail on two assessments may request a change of examiner. In the case of a retake, an individual assessment may replace a group assessment.

Assessed components:

Supervision and Learning, 1.5 credits

Forms of assessment:

Individual written assignment

Individual oral assignment

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass

A grade of Pass on the course requires a grade of Pass on all exams/components and completion of all compulsory learning activities.

Entry requirements

General and courses corresponding to the following Swedish Upper Secondary School Programs: Mathematics 2, Science 2, and Social Studies 1b/1a1+1a2. (Biology 1+Chemistry 1+Physics 1a/1b1+1b2 equals Science 1+2)
