# SVEB34, Swedish: Sociolinguistics, Level 2, 7.5 credits Svenska: Sociolingvistik, fortsättningskurs, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

## Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2020-12-07 to be valid from 2020-12-07, autumn semester 2021.

## **General Information**

The course is offered as a freestanding course and can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

## Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- provide a general account of sociolinguistics as a research domain
- account for social factors of importance to language use in speech and in writing
- at an advanced level, describe and discuss social, dialect and gender related variation in language use

#### Competence and skills

- apply concepts and analyses from a selection of sociolinguistic theories on relevant data, from Swedish and/or other languages
- formulate relevant sociolinguistic research questions
- in a knowledgeable way, analyse and assess the attitudes of people to different language variants and linguistic change

#### Judgement and approach

- critically discuss and relate to issues concerning the evaluation, planning and preservation of language
- critically discuss ethical issues relating to sociolinguistics

#### Course content

The course provides a specialisation in sociolinguistics as a research discipline. It presents key works and current research from a selection of research domains in sociolinguistics e.g. linguistic variation related to social class, gender and age, bilingualism and multilingualism and contact linguistics, attitudes to linguistic variation and conversation analysis. Results, hypotheses and methods are addressed.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and one to three compulsory seminars.

#### Assessment

The assessment is based on a written take-home exam and a sociolinguistic study that is presented orally and in writing at a compulsory seminar.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass on the course, students must have been awarded a Pass on both of the assessed components. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, students must have been awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the written examination.
