Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-03-20 and was last revised by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-10-09 (U 2023/767). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2024-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is a compulsory component in the first semester of Language Consultancy (Swedish). It can also be offered as a freestanding course and normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Knowledge and understanding

- account for Swedish language grammar (morphology and syntax) and basic semantics at a general level,

Competence and skills

- analyse and describe the Swedish language at different levels: word, phrase, and clause levels, with regard to form, function and meaning,
- undertake parsing in Swedish text examples,
- analyse and describe syntactic variation,

Judgement and approach

- take a scientific approach to grammar in speech and writing.

Course content

The course introduces grammar and lexical semantics, and students are trained to analyse and describe the Swedish language at different levels: word, phrase, and clause levels, with regard to form, function and meaning.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and exercises.

Assessment

Assessment is based on a written invigilated exam at the end of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
