

SVEG24, Swedish: Grammatical Description and Analysis, 5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-10-11 (U 2023/763). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is a compulsory component in the second semester of the Language Consultancy (Swedish) programme. The course can be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

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Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide an in-depth account of Swedish grammar,
- account for the basics of Swedish phonology and phonetics,
- account for the difference between normative and descriptive grammar,

Competence and skills

- use works of reference such as the Swedish Academy grammatical work and Swedish dictionaries,
- do a grammatical analysis of authentic language samples,
- do a phonological analysis of authentic language samples,

Judgement and approach

- discuss and take a position on questions that concern syntactical, morphological and phonological variation.

Course content

The module builds on the Swedish Grammar module in SVEG12. The module provides advanced and broadened study of the structure of the Swedish language. Emphasis is on active use of grammatical works, above all that of the Swedish Academy. The module also provides an introduction to Swedish phonology and phonetics.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and practical exercises.

Assessment

Assessment is based on 3-4 written assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
For the grade of Pass, the student must have been awarded at least this grade for all assignments. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have been awarded this grade for at least two assignments.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed the module Swedish Grammar 7.5 credits in the first semester of the Language Consultancy (Swedish) programme, SVEA41, SVEA43 or the equivalent.

- The course partly replaces the earlier course SVEG21.
- The number of credits allocated for course content that is shared in whole or in part with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
