# SVEH11, Swedish as a Foreign Language: Beginner's course 1, 7.5 credits

Svenska som främmande språk: Nybörjarkurs 1, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2021-12-15. The syllabus comes into effect 2021-12-15 and is valid from the autumn semester 2022.

### General information

The course is offered as a freestanding distance learning course. It may not be included in a degree at Lund University for students who already meet the requirement of Swedish proficiency for admission to higher education.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

#### Knowledge and understanding

- account for a few very simple grammatical structures and sentence patterns in a learnt repertoire in English
- describe a few cultural aspects of Swedish society in Swedish e.g. a few customs

#### Competence and skills

- orally ask and answer simple questions, and initiate and respond to simple statements in familiar areas (oral proficiency)
- write very short texts with simple phrases and sentences about their family, living conditions and educational background (written proficiency)
- follow and summarise slow and clearly articulated speech (listening comprehension)
- read and retell short simple texts containing high frequency words, including certain common international words (reading comprehension)

#### Judgement and approach

• identify their need for further knowledge and skills in the subject

#### Course content

The course is structured in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). The teaching aims to provide the students with the knowledge and skills required to achieve language proficiency in Swedish equivalent to level A1. The course consists of teaching and practical exercises dealing with Swedish vocabulary, pronunciation and sentence structure. Furthermore, text study and oral exercises are included.

### Course design

The whole course is offered as a distance learning course using an online learning platform and digital tools. The course includes scheduled live components. Students are required to participate under these conditions, and to have access to a computer with a web camera and an Internet connection. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

#### Assessment

The assessment of the course is based on a camera-monitored written exam (5.5 credits) and a camera-monitored oral exam (2 credits) via Zoom.

The camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording occurs. Live monitoring is required in order to assess the student's knowledge without the student having access to any aids. The oral exam tests the student's ability to ask and answer simple questions in a familiar area.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

### Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction For the grade of Pass on the whole course, students must have been awarded at least the grade of Pass on both the oral and written exams. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, students must also have been awarded this grade on at least 5.5 of the course credits.

# Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must meet the general entry requirements for higher education in Sweden (with the exception of proficiency in Swedish)
