SVEK10, Swedish Language: Level 3 - B. A. Course, 30 credits Svenska: Språklig inriktning - kandidatkurs, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-03-02 to be valid from 2017-03-02, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. it can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree. The course is a compulsory component of a degree of Bachelor in the main field of Swedish.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate specialised knowledge in a few selected parts of the subject of Swedish
- account for and apply basic knowledge of the theory of science and research methodology, focusing on aspects that are key to linguistics

Competence and skills

- independently perceive, formulate and discuss research issues from different perspectives, and propose solutions demonstrating insight into the requirements of a research study, understanding of the problem-solving nature of research, and ability to apply a scholarly perspective
- independently execute a minor research assignment in the subject of Swedish, and report it in an academic paper that complies with the genre conventions of the discipline of linguistics
- assess their own and and other's research solutions to problems and adopt a scholarly approach to language
- critically review and assess their own and other's texts, and have the skill to express themselves in speech and writing, particularly within academic genres

Judgement and approach

- identify their own need for further knowledge
- use well-supported arguments to discuss and assess the place of linguistics in the research community, as well as the role of research for citizens and society
- discuss issues concerning linguistics and linguistic methodology from an ethical perspective

Course content

The course includes two elective courses, in which the students will acquire specialised knowledge within a particular branch of the subject of Swedish. Linguistic theories and methods are discussed, including from a metaperspective. The knowledge and skills acquired are to be applied in a degree project, in which the students will reinforce their oral and written proficiency in Swedish, particularly within academic genres.

The course consists of three modules:

- 1. Elective Course, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Elective Course, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

The elective courses are to be selected from a set of courses that are offered within the subject of Swedish or adjacent subjects. A list of elective modules is available with the study advisor. The modules are to be approved by the examiner.

Course design

On module 3, the teaching consists of supervision and 4?6 compulsory seminars.

Supervision is normally limited to the semester when the student was first registered on the course. Exceptions can be made if there are special grounds.

Assessment

Information about the assessment of modules 1 and 2 is included in the relevant course syllabi.

The assessment of module 3 is partly based on a degree project, presented at a seminar, and partly on the student's critical review of a fellow student's degree project. The student's defence of their degree project and the critical review of a fellow student's project will also be included in the assessment. If it is not possible to organise an oral critical review, the examiner may decide to replace the oral critical review with a written assignment.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on module 3 (degree project) in addition to passing grades on all other modules.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed the course SVEA20 Swedish Language: Level 2, or the equivalent.

- 1. The course is offered at the the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
- 2. It replaces SVEK11. The elective modules can also be studied as freestanding courses. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
