Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-11-27 (U 2024/737). The syllabus comes into effect 2025-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2025.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course and is an elective component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics.

Specialisation

Language and Linguistics with specialization in Swedish/Scandinavian Languages

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- give an in-depth account of Swedish/Nordic grammar and describe current grammatical research and development work,
- insightfully compile and discuss advanced texts about grammar.

Competence and skills

- be able to analyse key grammatical problems in an advanced way,
- be able to independently identify and formulate relevant grammatical questions.

Judgement and approach

- reexamine and take a critical position on the research situation within the field of grammar.

Course content

The course is an advanced study of Swedish/Nordic grammar, which means the student must have previously completed an advanced course in grammar. The specific content is to be determined in consultation with the examiner and adapted to the interests and wishes of the student.

Course design

The teaching consists of independent study and supervision.

Assessment

The assessment consists of a take-home exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 90 credits, including at least 60 credits in Swedish or Nordic Languages, or in another language or linguistics. A basic course in Swedish/Nordic grammar must be included.
