Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- aided by the required reading, analyse various approaches of the philosophy of science towards cultural research
- independently account for a selected key debate within the philosophy of science pertaining to culture studies

Competence and skills

- interpret and apply key concepts in scholarly discussions
- approach practical issues in a reflective and logical manner

Judgement and approach

- identify and switch between various types of arguments in discussions and while problem solving as part of a group
- in a reflective manner, place a discussion in a historical context as well as in relation to new development trends in the philosophy of science of the humanities

Course content

The course provides the students with specialised knowledge of key issues concerning the philosophy of science and epistemology in research in the humanities and social sciences. Various epistemological perspectives within cultural analysis are studied in order to give students the possibility to identify and discuss epistemological aspects which are relevant to various approaches of cultural analysis. Current epistemological issues are also studied in a general historical context.

Course design

Teaching consists of classes in which students are expected to participate actively. This includes student presentations, group work, etc.

Assessment

Assessment is based on an individual written assignment.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

The highest grade is an A, and the lowest passing grade is an E. The grade for a failed result is Fail.
