Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for cultural phenomena and applied cultural analysis
- be able to account for both the theoretical and the methodological aspects of cultural analysis

Competence and skills

- be able to formulate a research issue within the field of cultural analysis
- be able to plan and carry out fieldwork under supervision

• be able to use concepts and methods of cultural analysis for solving practical tasks issued by an external employer

Judgement and approach

• be able to reflect critically on the potential and limitations of the practical application of cultural analysis in companies, institutions and organisations.

Course content

The course is an introduction to the practical and professional uses of cultural analysis in both private and public organisations. It aims to provide the students with a common platform on which to build during the subsequent courses of the programme. A field study is carried out with the aim of developing skills used in the application of cultural analysis within various organisations.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, 2-3 workshops and exercises, and a field study in which students work in groups. The field study is concluded by an oral presentation. Participation in exercises and the fieldwork, including the final presentation, is compulsory. In the event of absence during any mandatory part, a written compensation statement must be carried out.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written take-home assignment.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have a Bachelor's degree in the Humanities or Social Sciences, or the equivalent.
